## Dear Sir / Madam, applicant for antigen rapid test!

The virus can be detected by the antigen rapid test method

- between 4 and 14 days after infection.
- Kelen Hospital assistant trained for this examination will take sample of the pharynx and nasal mucosa. Sampling should be done vigorously in order to include the cells from the mucosa.
- You can wait for the result on the spot, within 15 minutes we will provide a written report on the result.

## What could be the result of the antigen rapid test?

**positive**: the virus is detectable, you are contagious. Notify your GP of the test result. **negative**: the virus cannot be detected. Due to your symptoms, a PCR examination is obligatory, which you can perform at Kelen Hospital for a fee or free of charge arranged by your GP. Notify your GP of the test result.

## What adverse reactions are to be expected?

- a. Sampling is uncomfortable, can cause vomiturition, and is very rarely could be painful
- b. The sampling site may bleed temporarily. This is mainly happening if you are taking an anticoagulant, an inhibitor of platelet aggregation.
- c. If you make a sudden large movement during the test, the sampler may break and this should rarely be removed with forceps.
